

The Battle of Sullivan's Island & the Siege of Charleston

8:45 a.m.: Bus departs Hampton Inn Historic Charleston hotel in Charleston, S.C.



9:15 a.m.- 11:45 p.m.: Tours of Fort Moultrie National Historical Park and the Breach Inlet site led by independent historians Cordell Bragg and Doug MacIntyre.

12:15-4:30 p.m.: Lunch, tours of the Charleston siege lines led by historian Carl Borick, and a visit to the Charleston Museum to view its exhibitions relating to Charleston during the American Revolution.

The day-long battlefield tour includes guided tours exploring various locations that encompassed the Battle of Sullivan's Island on June 28, 1776, and the 1780 Siege of Charleston. A boxed lunch is included.


